Summary:

Prayer is not forced into a particular time slot or made into a dramatic display, but communing with God and fellowshiping with Him in the midst of our daily lives. Spending time with God shapes our motives so that when we pray, we ask for things that please Him instead of ourselves. Because of what Jesus Christ did and our belief in it, our minds have been freed to pray confidently and in faith.

Notes:

1. Our prayers are how we spend time with God. He will never keep anything back from us.
2. God is low-key, not dramatic. He often does things secretly and reveals Himself in subtle ways. Fellowshiping with Him daily tunes us in to the often-unnoticed ways He gets involved in our lives.
3. The motives behind our prayers are important. We must pray for things that please Him.
4. Most people are motivated to please themselves instead of God. This affects their prayer lives because when they pray they ask for the wrong things. Communing with the Word allows the Holy Spirit to work in us and change our desires.
