Summary:

When we got born again and became new creations in Christ, we immediately became holy, righteous, and sanctified. Our identities are already within us because God, who is all these things, lives in us. We must avoid the mistake of letting our actions determine who we are, and instead accept by faith who God says we are. Genuinely believing this allows us to work out the righteousness already in us so that we can bear fruit. Constantly renewing our minds to the identity God has given us keeps us separate and apart from an unholy world.

Notes:

- 1. We immediately became holy and sanctified when we accepted Christ Jesus. Believers aren't "sinners saved by grace," but saints. We must accept this by faith.
- 2. We must be completely convinced of our righteousness; this is our identity in Christ. The enemy will try to convince us that we aren't holy, and he will lay blame on us. We must therefore know who we are and be rock-solid in our faith in what God has done through Jesus.
- 3. If we're in Jesus and He's living in us, then we're as holy and sanctified as He is. We must renew our minds to the identity God gave us. If Jesus, the vine, is righteous and holy, then we are too.
- 4. Believers are set apart from the world; God's plan is for others to see His Son in us. To know Jesus and His grace is to know God.
- 5. We can praise God regardless of what happens or doesn't happen. Letting Him lead the way and following Him gives us sweatless victory.
