Summary:

In the Old Testament, the people lived by the Law of Moses, but when Jesus came, He freed us from the law and gave us something better and greater to use to guide our lives. The law kept people in bondage to the requirement of keeping each and every law; no one was able to do that, so God sent His grace in human form to replace the law with a better covenant. What this means for us is that if we've been born again, we have access to the Spirit of grace who gives us victory in every area.

Notes:

- 1. Jesus frees us from self-effort and the law; we now have the Spirit to guide us. As Christians, we no longer need to rely on the Law of Moses.
- 2. The Holy Spirit teaches us things we could never learn through our five senses. He takes us from the cheaper to the deeper; we need His assistance because we can't succeed on our own.
- 3. The law increases sin-consciousness, but grace gives us victory over sin. The Ten Commandments were given to get the people to try to do things they could not do by themselves.
- 4. The Holy Spirit teaches us how to believe right and leads us into all truth. He not only tells us secrets, but also shows us things that haven't happened yet.
- 5. God is no longer concerned about sin because Jesus already took care of it. Grace doesn't condone sin, but rather changes us and moves us away from it.
