Summary:

To rightly divide and correctly analyze the Word of truth, we must understand the contrast between the old and the new covenants. In the Old Testament, animal blood was the sacrifice for sin, whereas in the New Testament, Jesus' blood was the sacrifice; in this respect, there is no comparison between the two agreements. Knowing the difference between old and new transforms and frees us.

Notes:

- Christ shed His blood to bring us out from under the law and free us from self-effort. Jesus' blood was required for God to create the New Testament. This distinguishes the New Testament from the Old Testament, which required animal blood.
- 2. Believers have gone from being God's servants to being His sons and daughters. We don't have to be afraid of God like the people in the Old Testament were. We now have the boldness to call God our Father. There has been a shift from a servant-master relationship to a children-father relationship.
- 3. The new covenant allows us to have the same glorified bodies that Jesus has in heaven. We are flesh and blood; before His resurrection, Jesus also had flesh and blood like us. When we get to heaven, we will have flesh and bone bodies with no blood, like Jesus has. When we get to heaven, our glorified bodies will be our immortal heavenly temples.
- 4. We need the light of God to get into heaven. Being born again restores that light to us.
