Summary:

To rightly divide and correctly analyze the Word of truth, we must understand the contrast between the old and the new covenants. One of the major changes from the old to the new is that we now have the opportunity to receive new natures and be led by the Holy Spirit, who comes to live in born-again believers. Now, instead of having to rely on what we must do to be in right-standing with God, we only need to believe in what Jesus already did.

Notes:

- 1. Christ shed His blood to bring us out from under the law and free us from self-effort. Jesus' blood was required for God to create the New Testament.
- 2. Jesus' blood is infinitely better than animal blood when we need forgiveness for sin. Animal blood only *covered* sin for one year; Jesus' blood completely *removed* it forever.
- 3. Believers have gone from being God's servants to being His sons and daughters. We now have the boldness to call God our Father. We do not have to be afraid of God like the people in the Old Testament were.
- 4. *We* are flesh and blood; before His resurrection, Jesus also had flesh and blood like us. When we get to heaven, we will have flesh and bone bodies with no blood, like Jesus has. When we get to heaven, our glorified bodies will be our immortal heavenly temples.
- 5. We need the light of God to get into heaven. Being born again restores that light to us.
