Summary:

During Jesus' ministry, His entry into the city of Jerusalem fulfilled Old-Testament prophecy and gave the people hope. Contrary to coming as a military conqueror or a political ruler, He came to bring peace and salvation to those who believed in Him. This event preceded the people turning against Jesus and His eventual death; however, **Jesus'** death gave **us** victory over death and access to eternal life. Faith in Christ and in His freewill sacrifice of Himself is enough to provide forgiveness in God's eyes for all our sins—even the ones we have not committed yet. This is cause for great rejoicing.

Notes:

- 1. Jesus' arrival in Jerusalem was highly celebrated, but few knew its true significance.
- 2. His entry riding on a donkey fulfilled Old-Testament prophecy. This entrance has strong ties to the covenant of grace we now live under.
- 3. What Jesus' death accomplished for us includes removal of our sin and our guilt, propitiation, reconciliation, redemption, and defeat of the power of darkness.
- 4. We no longer have to suffer from the shame and condemnation associated with sin. Jesus was the compensation, the payment, and the peace offering for our sins.
